

WCF Standard – Breed standards: Deutsch Langhaar

Body:

German the Longhair is a large, well muscled cat, with a long, rectangular body. The thorax is round and well developed, the neck is strong. The muscular legs are of medium length; the large paws are round and firm and between the footpads well furred. The tail is of medium length, large at the base and developing more slender to the tip, which is slightly rounded.

Head:

The trapezoidal head with high set rounded cheeks and blunt muzzle is longer than wide. The wide chin is moderately developed. The slightly swung profile ends in a medium long, broad nose back, which curves slightly roman.

Ears:

The ears are medium sized, slightly diagonal and placed far apart . They are broad at the base and have a rounded tip.

Eyes:

The eyes are oval, large and open. They stand slightly diagonal and in far distance to each other.

Coat:

The cat has long coat, a collar and “Knickerbockers” (well fluffy coated trouser on the back-legs). The coat is of shining, silky structure and possesses undercoat. Preference is to be given to animals, whose long coat divides in a central vertex on the back.

Colour variants:

All coat colours are permitted. The eyes are uniformly coloured. All eye colours are permitted.

Faults:

To short coat, missing undercoat and coat of equal length at the whole body are a fault. Likewise a too straight profile or a stop is evaluated as serious faults.

Points:

Body: 30 points

Head: 30 points

Coat: 20 points

Colour and pattern: 10 points

Condition: 10 points
